What is Ignite? Ignite is a volunteer program that provides ski, snowboard, cross country ski, and other snow sport lessons to people with physical, cognitive, or developmental disabilities.

For whom? High school students ages 16 - 18 are eligible to be junior instructors.

Where is it? Eldora Mountain Resort.

Why do it? Ignite is a fun and meaningful way to log community service hours and to share the love of the outdoors.

How can I volunteer? There are many types of Ignite volunteers:

- Alpine ski or snowboard instructors (help with on-slope lessons)
- Nordic ski instructors (help with on-mountain Nordic lessons)
- Client Services (greet clients and families, organization, etc.)
- Equipment managers (manage adaptive ski equipment)

How do I get started?

- Attend ONE orientation at the Jewish Community Center on Arapahoe Ave:
 - Wednesday, Oct 19th from 7PM – 9PM OR
 - Thursday, October 27th from 7PM – 9PM OR
 - Saturday, October 29th from 10AM – 12PM

What is the commitment?

- Come to the Junior Instructors' meeting on November 6th from 4-6pm
- Complete 4 clinics in November and December (2 on-snow and 2 in classrooms)
- Volunteer at Eldora on SIX days from end of December 2016 to March 31, 2017. You get to pick which days you assist with lessons and students.
